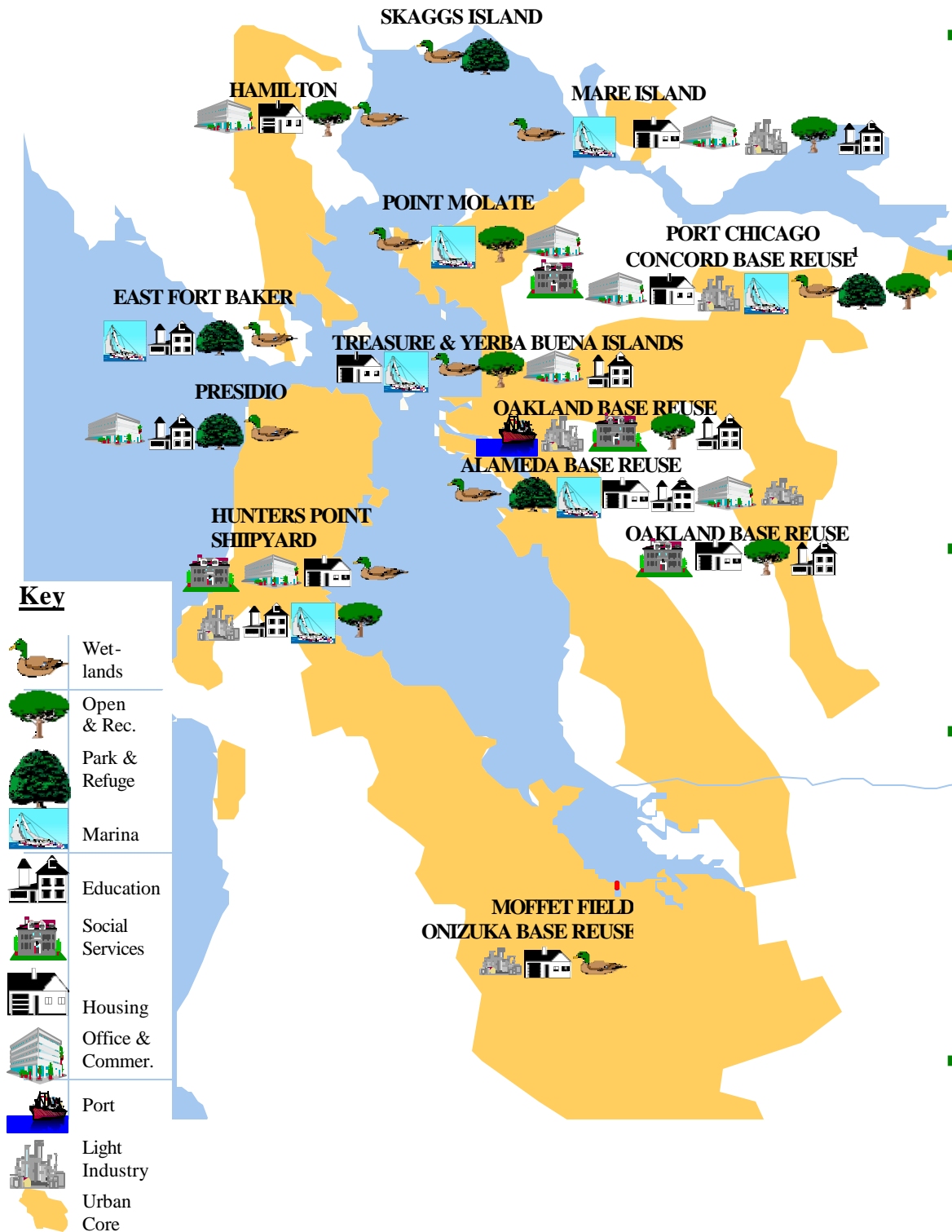


# The Goal

**NOTE:** Neither Port Chicago Nor Concord Naval Weapons Station have been closed by an official act of the military or a base closure commission, nevertheless the Navy has removed the weapons stored at the site and it is now in care-taker, or discontinued status. Arc Ecology projects that these sites will be incorporated into the next round of base closures, when Congress approves the process.
