

In creating park concepts, the community needs to think about the kinds of experiences and activities the park can offer, such as the mix of activities and their location, the kinds of businesses and jobs the park should generate and attract, the size of the park, the relationship to nearby neighborhoods, parks, and plans for the Shipyard. The process begins with two basic questions: What kind of park would you like to see, and what would you like to see in it?
